In 2009 The Conference Cup was the successor to the Evening Standard Challenge Trophy, which originated in 1992. Winners of the Evening Standard Challenge Trophy were Finchley (4), Teddington (3), Ealing (3), Brondesbury (2), and once each for Bromley, Radlett, High Wycombe, and Malden Wanderers. Winners of The Conference Cup were, Finchley, Wanstead, Lordswood, Valley End, Waltham, and Reigate Priory. There was no competition in 2015 & 2016.

The Bertie Joel Cup, originally known as the Kemps Cup, was created by Joel . one of London cricket's legendary characters in 1967 as a midweek, 45-overs knockout competition. Winners of the Bertie Joel Cup were Bishop's Stortford (5), Waltham (5), Cambridge Granta (4), Hampstead (4), Wimbledon (4), Forest Hill (3), Sutton (3), Basingstoke & North Hants (2), Shenfield (2), The Mote (2), and once each for Indian Gymkhana, Vauxhall Motors, Blackheath, Hastings & St Leonards Priory, Southgate, Ickenham, North Middlesex, Finchley, Saffron Walden, Eastcote, British Airways, Lambeth Enterprise, South Woodford, BWIA Cavaliers, Malden Wanderers, and West Indies United
 - Evidence of a truly remarkable competition.
